ckground :	At the 2009 FEI General Assembly, measures were

	focus on, but are not restricted to, the reduction of
	positive doping and medication cases, whether
	deliberate or non-intentional.
	This Veterinary Guidance note explains the purpose
	behind the introduction of treatment areas at FEI
	events, and their use.
rpose and Use:	Treatment areas at FEI events
	Medication in horses is only permitted whilst under FEI
	competition rules when controlled and authorized by
	FEI Veterinary Delegates. The latter must complete an
	ETUE (formerly an MF 1 or 2) as a record of
	authorization. Examples can be found at Annex 2 of the
	Veterinary Regulations 2010 (see VGn2/2010).
	Unless by special permission of the FEI veterinary
	delegate, such treatments must take place only in
	designated treatment areas.

	The purpose of this measure is to ensure as much as
	possible that inappropriate treatments are not being
	applied which are contrary to the spirit of clean sport
	and the welfare of the horse.
	Treatment areas are to be used to achieve this purpose
	wherever possible, unless by prior arrangement with an
	FEI Veterinary Delegate (i.e. required fluid therapy).
	The Person Responsible for the treatments must be
	able to provide a copy of the ETUE authorization
	required to allow such treatments when requested by
	either an FEI veterinary official or steward.

Notes to Organizing Committees	FEI Veterinary delegates are to work with Organizing Committees in advance to ensure that treatment areas are available and fit for purpose.
	Organizing committees are to also ensure that there is adequate stewarding to assist with veterinary delegate supervision of treatment areas and the above criteria have been met.
