## **PLAYERS**

**For the EC, each team can come with 8 players and a minimum of 6 players are mandatory.**

## **HORSES**

**For the EC each team can come with 8 ponies but 7 ponies are mandatory.**

**FOR THE EC EACH PONY ARE LIMITED TO 4 MATCHES FOR THE WHOLE COMPETITION.**

## **IV. FACILITIES OFFERED**

### **1. TEAMS (12 persons)**

### **3. WELCOME**

The time and date of arrival of riders and horses and their means of transport must be given to the OC in order to facilitate them on arrival.

#### **HORSE ENTRIES IN THE SHOW GROUND**

- 16<sup>th</sup> July (Monday) – After 2.00 p.m. until 8.00 p.m.
- 17<sup>th</sup> July (Tuesday) – After 9.00 a.m. until 1.00 p.m.
- **Horses must leave the Show Ground at least Monday – 23**



**July before 1.00 p.m.**

**In the moment of the arriving the Team Leader must give the horses passports and the Identification cards of the players to the OC, in order to control the inscriptions and what is established in the FIHB SR and FIHB GR for horses and players.**

#### **4. LOCAL TRANSPORTATION - ARRANGEMENTS FROM HOTEL TO SHOWGROUNDS**

The OC guarantees the transportation between the Lisbon Airport (POR) and the Hotel.

The OC guarantees the transportation between the Hotel and the Show grounds if necessary. Please check in the reception the bus schedules.

The NF must indicate by **July 1<sup>st</sup>**, if they need this kind of service.

#### **2. PRIZE - CLASSIFICATION**

The prize for best Player and Horse will be decided by the Team Leaders (with their coaches) and by the Ground Jury.

#### **3. PRIZE GIVING CEREMONY**

All the players must be present, on horse back, in the Prize Giving Ceremony with the Team Leader and the Coach.

All of them must respect the information of the Stewards in order to guarantee the best ceremony organisation.

#### **4. INSURANCES**

All owners, players and other members of the Teams are personally responsible for damages to third parties caused by themselves, their employees, their agents or their horses. They are therefore strongly advised to take out third-party insurance providing full coverage for participation in equestrian events at home and abroad, and to keep the policy up to date.

#### **5. ENTRY RIGHT TO SHOWGROUNDS (Art. 133, 1005)**





The entrance in the Show Area is free.  
The entrance on the Stables Area is just allowed for Teams.  
Owners can enter by appointment of the Team Leader and with an authorisation of the OC.

### **3. CUSTOMS FORMALITIES**

NFs holding an international event in their country should inform their National Veterinary Authority and their Customs Authority at least four weeks beforehand. They should request every facility to assist the movement of horses accompanied by FEI or NF's Passports, and the necessary veterinary certification at frontier points into and out their countries. (Vet. Regs. Art. 1004.2)

### **MCP CENTRAL LABORATORY – APPLICABLE ONLY TO GROUPS I & II**

Under the Medication Control Programme (MCP) in Groups I & II, all samples collected in accordance with Vet. Regs. Art. 1016 will be analysed by the **Laboratoire des Courses Hippiques (LCH)**. The central MPC Laboratory will be reviewed in June 2005. Please refer to FEI Bulletin for further information. For events other than those listed in Vet. Regs. Art. 1016 or for events than Groups I and II, samples may be analysed at an alternative FEI listed laboratory (Vet Regs Art. 1021).

## **STABLE SECURITY / STEWARDING AT INTERNATIONAL EVENTS**

### **1. ACCESS TO STABLE AREA**

The stables must be completely enclosed within a suitable restrictive perimeter (stable area) which will act both as a deterrent to the admission of unauthorised persons and to the exit of horses. The area must be sufficiently large to allow horses to be evacuated from the stables in an emergency but still remain within the confines of the perimeter.

Whenever possible the stable area must include only stables, lorries, caravans, etc., should not be permitted within the area unless specifically needs as accommodation for horses and/or grooms.

Access to stables must be limited to those persons indicated in VRs Art. 1005.2.5. It is essential that the official issuing authorised access be a responsible person of seniority within the OC.

### **2. CONTROL OF ACCESS**

A control system must be operated at all entrance gates so that there is an efficient and reliable method of identifying those who enter and leave the stables area at any time.

Extra vigilance must be used in establishing the identity of persons and reasons for entering the stables during the night.

### **3. STEWARDING OF STABLE AREA**



At least one stable steward, directly responsible to the OC, must be present or readily available in the vicinity of the stable area 24 hours a day, during the entire duration of the event. He may be assisted by deputies as required. The steward/deputies must regularly patrol the stable area, without establishing any predetermined pattern, to discourage any form of illegal practices or abuses to horses. Any misdemeanours must be reported immediately to the stable steward who must, in turn, report to the OC. The duty of the stewards is therefore to safeguard the welfare of the horses and to prevent any form of illegal practices.

#### **4. STEWARDING OF STABLE AREA**

It is appreciated that grooms wish to remain with their horses during the night. Only grooms duly registered with the OC are permitted to do so. The Person Responsible must ensure that his/her grooms, or any other authorised persons with access to horses, are familiar with the security and stewarding procedures operating at the event attended.

#### **5. MOVEMENT THROUGHOUT EVENT GROUNDS**

Movement of horses between the stables, practice, and grazing and main arena must be strictly controlled. The optimum layout for Horse-Ball discipline is attached.



# THE FEI CODE OF CONDUCT

## FOR THE WELFARE OF THE HORSE

The Fédération Equestre Internationale (FEI) expects all those involved in international equestrian sport to adhere to the FEI's Code of Conduct and to acknowledge and accept that at all times the welfare of the horse must be paramount and must never be subordinated to competitive or commercial influences.

1. At all stages during the preparation and training of competition horses, welfare must take precedence over all other demands. This includes good horse management, training methods, farriery and tack, and transportation.
2. Horses and competitors must be fit, competent and in good health before they are allowed to compete. This encompasses medication use, surgical procedures that threaten welfare or safety, pregnancy in mares and the misuse of aids.
3. Events must not prejudice horse welfare. This involves paying careful attention to the competition areas, ground surfaces, weather conditions, stabling, site safety and fitness of the horse for onward travel after the event.
4. Every effort must be made to ensure that horses receive proper attention after they have competed and that they are treated humanely when their competition careers are over. This covers proper veterinary care, competition injuries, euthanasia and retirement.
- 5. The FEI urges all involved with the sport to attain the highest levels of education in their areas of expertise.**
